## JUNIOR DIVISIONS (5-18)

## FINE ARTS

1. Entries must be ORIGINAL WORK (NO Kits or copies) done after Oct. of the previous year.
2. All photographs in each group MUST be entered in the photography class within the Art Group for that entry. Ex. For Adult Group II (Hobby Artists) ALL photographs are to be entered in Class 24 (ALL Photography). Therefore, Hobby Artist's photographs cannot be entered in Classes 15-23. These guidelines apply to all groups with a photography class.
3. LABEL YOUR ENTRIES on the back with name, phone number and class \# (category).
4. Adult artwork (Group 1, II, or III) Must have the edges of the canvas finished or be framed. Also, use sturdily attached wire hangers that can be used to easily hang the artwork. Wire fastened to the edge of the frame are best. Small hooks do not work on the lattice boards used to display the art. HANGERS FASTENED WITH STRING, TAPE, GLUE OR PAPER CLIPS do not hold up and ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE. Those entries will not be judged.
5. Student artwork (seniors in high school or younger) (Groups IV, V, VI VII) may be framed or matted with cardboard AND have a wire hanger. HANGERS FASTENED ONLY WITH STRING, TAPE, GLUE, OR PAPER CLIPS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE.
6. Each artist will be permitted one entry in each class for that group, and each artist may be entered in only one group (i.e. either Hobby Artists or Professionals or Senior Citizens)
7. Entries will be accepted from 2:00 p.m. until 6:45 p.m. on Tuesday. NO ENTRIES will be accepted before 2:00 p.m. or after 6:45 p.m. on Tuesday. Hanging and display of art entries will begin at 7:00 p.m. 8. Entries are to be picked up from Noon-4:00 p.m. on Sunday. Entries are limited in size to $24^{\prime \prime} \times 36^{\prime \prime}$ maximum.
8. Name and phone number will be written on the exhibitor's tag and on the back of the art.
9. In no case will the Chamber or any of its volunteers be held responsible for damages. For this reason, we recommend that you do not use expensive frames.

## STUDENT GROUPS—Group IV, V, VI or VII

ENTER ONLY ONE GROUP (Ex. Senior High or Junior High) \& ONLY ONE ENTRY IN EACH CLASS OF THAT GROUP. Two or Three dimensional art is accepted.

## FOOD PREPARATION—BAKING \& BEST OF WHEAT

## RULES:

1. Food must be on a disposable plate in a ziplock bag. (Plastic bags with twist ties are NOT acceptable.)
2. No commercial mixes may be used.
3. Full loaves of yeast bread or quick breads must be entered, baked in a loaf pan no smaller than $81 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 25 / 8^{\prime \prime}$.
4. Cookies, cupcakes, biscuits \& rolls must be entered in sets of three (3). For the most uniform rolls-don't enter ones from the corners of the pan.)
5. Winning entries placing 1st through 5th, will remain on display throughout the Jamboree. Bread winners will have $1 / 2$ loaf on display. Winning pie entries will have $1 / 8$ th piece of pie on display. One corner of the winning cakes will be on display.
6. The rest of the food entries will be released Wednesday from 4:00-7:00 p.m. Any food left after that time will be disposed of by the Chamber.
7. Displayed items and ribbons will be released Sunday from Noon-4:00 p.m.
8. No glass or metal baking dishes or pie pans will be accepted. Aluminum foil pans are accepted.
9.NO fresh fruit is to be used to decorate items.
