

OUTHOUSE RACE RULES

Team:

1. A team shall consist of a maximum of four (4) people of humanoid origin, including a driver (minimum age of 12 years). All my sign “hold harmless” agreement.
2. Driver/Pilot must wear a helmet (bicycle, ATV, etc.)

Construction:

1. Out houses must be built to accommodate one (1) driver and be pushed/pulled by three others.
 2. The base of the outhouse must be a minimum of nine (9) sq. ft. (3'x3') for stability, maximum overall width including push bar not to exceed six (6) feet. out houses must have three sides between five (5) to six (6) feet from the bottom of the outhouse and roof.
 3. Drivers/pilot seat must be attached with functional hole and toilet paper roll attached inside (newspaper optional).
 4. Outhouse must have a minimum of four wheels, minimum 4 inch diameter in contact with the ground for durations of the race. Steering and brakes optional. (Course will not be straight!)
 5. Outhouse must have three sides and a forward facing door(s) [with Crescent moon] which is secured open when in motion.
 6. Each outhouse must have a “Name” displayed on each side. (Sponsors names may be applied).
 7. Outhouses may not be powered by anything other than three (3) team members pushing/pulling. no motors of any kind, no pedals or anything other device to propel the unit.
 8. Outhouses will be inspected by our safety team. We reserve the right to refuse a teams participation if we deem the outhouse to be unsafe.

This will be a timed event: out houses must navigate a coned marked Serpentine course to a marked parking spot. When in parking spot, the pilot/driver must exit the outhouse to complete three (3) obstacles.

1. Obstacle: place the toilet paper onto the holder (something women think men are incapable of accomplishing).
2. Obstacle: ring toss, lob rings onto bottle necks, must achieve 1 ring on a bottle before proceeding.
3. Obstacle: navigate a ball up maze with strings to the designated hole.
